Main drop off is staffed with an employee who educates and assists in sorting. GJCRI states that very little is thrown away from their collection stream due to their diligence and clearly marked bins.

<u>Materials accepted:</u> Plastics # 1, 2, & 5 bottles and containers. No clamshell containers, no bags. Aluminum cans, steel cans, glass bottles, paper, paperboard & unprinted corrugated cardboard only.

Single stream recycling – supplies customers with 65-gallon cans – picks up every other week–\$8/month

Materials accepted: #1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 7 (no clamshells), aluminum cans, steel cans, glass bottles, paper, paperboard, coated juice/milk containers & printed and unprinted corrugated cardboard.

Palisade - Curbside pick up operated by Waste Management - drop off area is no longer available

Follow Waste Management guidelines. Residents who live outside of the Town of Palisade can dropped off recyclable items at GJCRI or Waste Management in GJ or can hire Monument Recycling for twice a month pick up.

Fruita - Curbside pick up operated by Waste Management

Residential recycling is collected bi-monthly at no charge to City residents. A sign-up form is required for recycling and bins are available at the Administration Department of the City of Fruita at 325 E. Aspen. Follow Waste Management's accepted materials and requirements.

Food Waste Composting – CMU Sustainability Council has a food waste composting facility on the WCC campus that is open to public donations. Please see their website for more details https://www.coloradomesa.edu/student-life/clubs-organizations/sustainability-council/index.html

Goodwill, Salvation Army, Habitat for Humanity, and numerous other thrift stores accept clothing, shoes, games, toys, kitchenware, appliances, etc. Unsold clothing at Goodwill is bailed and shipped to Colorado Springs or further sorting with the unusable fabric being turned into carpet.

Plastic Film is accepted at City Market and Walmart grocery stores. Plastic Film includes grocery bags, bread bags, vegetable bags, cereal bags, ziplock bags, case wrap (toilet paper, paper towels, etc.), pallet wrap, dry cleaning bags, bubble wrap, and plastic air pillows (in shipping boxes). Plastic must be clean and dry. *City Market stores have a Zero Waste initiative and have confirmed that all of their pallet wrap and other in-store recyclable materials are recycled.
